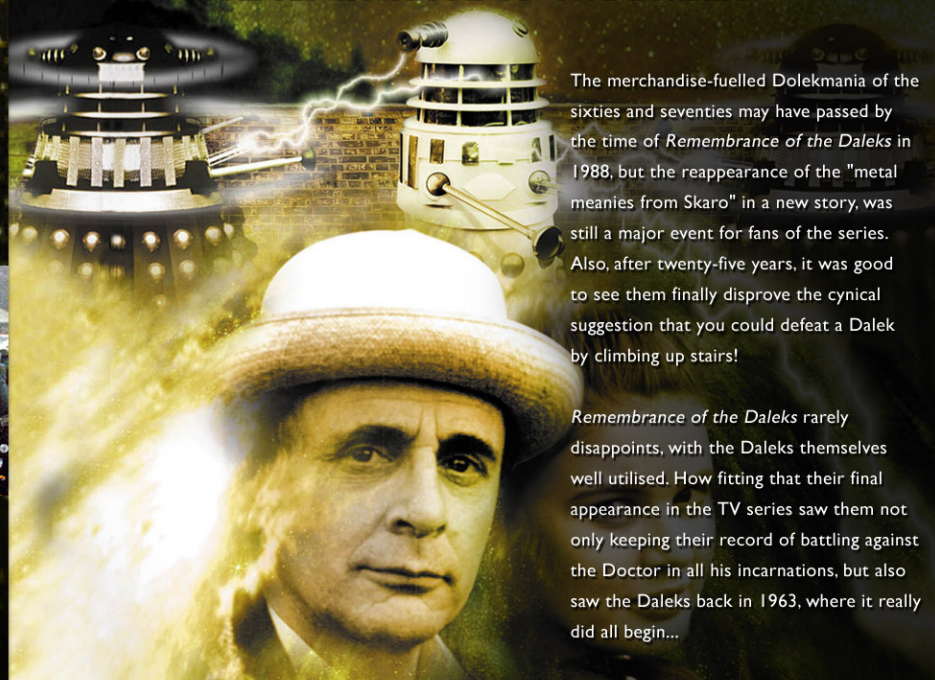

COMMENTARY

Sylvester McCoy started his acting career with the *Ken Campbell Roadshow* alongside Campbell and amongst others - Bob Hoskins. It was here that McCoy undertook a number of madcap stunts which included shoving ferrets down his trousers, setting light to his head, and hammering nails up his nose. Television appearances on *Tiswas* and as one of the 'O-Men' on *Jigsaw* followed. It was whilst starring in *The Pied Piper* at the National Theatre that *Doctor Who* producer John Nathan-Turner saw McCoy, and immediately lined him up for the role of the seventh Doctor in 1987. McCoy stayed in the role for three years, until the BBC axed the series in 1989, but did return briefly in 1996 when the *Doctor Who TV Movie* saw the seventh Doctor regenerate into the form of Paul McGann's Doctor number eight.



Sophie Aldred had only just begun her acting career when she landed the part of 'Ace' in 1986. On television, she has also appeared in the children's series *Corners* and *Melvin and Maureen's Music-a-Grams*, whilst on stage has appeared in productions of *Daisy Pulls It Off* and *Lust*. In 1996, she co-authored 'Ace!', a book focusing on her time in *Doctor Who*.

DELETED SCENES

Thirteen deleted or extended scenes from the story are included on this disc, with introductory text giving background details.

OUT-TAKES

A 4-minute compilation of bloopers, mistakes or just plain silliness from the making of this story.

MULTI-ANGLE SCENES
